DAY CAMP

Boys and girls ages 6-10

Young players will learn soccer fundamentals, including technical skills and game rules. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing. Each camper will receive hands-on instruction from college coaches, based on the player's level of skill and tactical development. Each camper will receive giveaway items.

ELITE CAMP

Boys and girls ages 10-14

Youth players will learn high-level technical abilities and basic tactical strategies. Sessions will cover ball control, dribbling, passing, receiving, and finishing, as well as creating space, combination plays, transition play, and styles of play. Each camper will receive intensive instruction from coaches, based on skill and tactical development, as well as video analysis of technical abilities. Goalkeeper training will be available. Each camper will receive giveaway items.

1-DAY PREMIER CAMP

Young men ages 15-18

Premier players will prepare for high-level high school soccer and the college game by learning through small-sided games, a technical session, and a full-sided game. Goalkeeper training will be available throughout the day. Sessions will cover the mental and physical aspects of the game to teach players the motivational skills required for high-level competition. The high school camp includes a team "bonding" activity with current members of the Wartburg team, a college search session, and a Subway lunch. Each camper will receive a T-shirt.

FACILITIES

Campers will utilize some of the best outdoor facilities in the Iowa Conference. Camp drills and game action will be held on Knights Soccer Complex and Walston-Hoover Stadium.

PARENTS: Each registered camper will receive a confirmation letter, including map and directions, rules and regulations, and check-in information. On the final day of each session, parents are invited to observe their sons and daughters during the instruction period. All participants are required to comply with the rules and regulations of Wartburg College and the Sports Camps. Any violation of these rules will result in immediate dismissal from the camp.

TRANSPORTATION

If you fly, transportation to campus will be provided from the Waterloo Municipal Airport, located 15 miles south of Waverly. It is important to notify our office at least two weeks prior to camp of your flight number and arrival time. Delta Airlines is the only carrier serving the Waterloo airport. Parking will be provided for campers who drive to Waverly, but they will not be permitted to use their vehicles at any time during the camp.

CAMP STAFF

Kirk Artist, Men's Head Coach

Kirk Artist became Wartburg's third full-time men's head coach in June 2010. In his first season, Wartburg shared conference championship honors and reached the final round of the 2010 IIAC tournament.



A 2006 graduate of Wartburg, he's experienced success as both a player and coach for the Knights. On the pitch, he helped guide the program to four straight 10-or-more win seasons including the only 20-or-more-win campaign in program history in 2004 when the Orange and Black reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Division III tournament. He was a two-time team Most Valuable Player and a four-time all-Iowa Conference honoree which included first-team awards in 2004 and 2005.

Tiffany Pins, Women's Head Coach

A 2005 graduate of Wartburg, Tiffany Pins had been an assistant coach at Denison University in Ohio since July 2007.



While playing and coaching under former head coach Jim Conlon, she was part of a strong Knights' program. The three-time team Most Valuable Player and 2004 all-Iowa Conference honoree starred on squads that won 10-or-more matches twice including a 16-3-1 mark during her senior season. As an assistant, she helped lead two teams that reached 10-or-more victories including a 14-6 mark in 2005. That theme continued at Denison. During her stay, the school reached the Elite Eight this past fall as part of three NCAA Division III tournament berths. The program also won two regular season and one North Coast Athletic Conference tournament title.

Josh Sanderson, Assistant Men's Coach

Formerly a graduate assistant coach at NCAA Division II Bemidji State University in Minnesota from 2007-09, assistant coach Josh Sanderson also gained coaching experience at North Dakota State University as a volunteer assistant in 2006-07 and with the Red River Soccer Club of Fargo, N.D., as a head and assistant coach for various boys and girls squads from 2006-08. He earned his bachelor's degree from NDSU in December 2005 and a master's degree from Bemidji State in May 2009. In his first year with the Knights, he helped lead the program to an Iowa Conference postseason tournament title and NCAA Division III postseason tournament appearance.



Kyle Nelson, Assistant Women's Coach

A former men's soccer player and four-year letterwinner at Luther, Kyle Nelson led the Decorah High School boys' program to a 75-13 record in five seasons, including a third-place finish at the 2010 Iowa High School boys' state tournament. During his tenure at Decorah, the Vikings were ranked in the top 10 in their class all five seasons he was head coach. His other coaching experience includes two years as assistant with the Luther men's team and seven years as a youth coach for the Decorah United Soccer Club. He also is the current U-11 Girls Academy Director for the CVYSA Competitive Program. Nelson has his Iowa Board of Educational Examiners Coaching Authorization, USSF National D License, NSCAA State GK Diploma, NSCAA Regional GK Diploma, and NSCAA National Diploma.
